ORDINANCE NO. 04-07-01

An Ordinance Establishing Prevailing Wage Rates for the Village of Ringwood

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended (820 ILCS 130/1 et seq.), and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Ringwood investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village employed in performing construction of public works, for said Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Ringwood, McHenry County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: To the extent and as required but "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics

and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Ringwood is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the McHenry County area as determined by the Illinois Department of Labor as of June of the current year, a copy of said determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Illinois Department of Labor shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Village of Ringwood. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

- Section 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village of Ringwood to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.
- Section 3: The Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village of Ringwood this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rates of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.
- Section 4: The Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

Section 5: The Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Secretary of State and the Illinois Department of Labor in Springfield.

Section 6: The Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a notice of passage of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

MCHENRY COUNTY

IRONWORKERS (EASI) - That part of the county East of Rts. 47 and 14.

IRONWORKERS (SOUTH) - That part of the county South of Route 14 and East of Route 47.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOI.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTCS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polithing of all clusses of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cament tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaucs, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of rethod on all tile work, particularly and
